Melchizedek note: King of Righteousness

Hebrews 7

He is first, by translation of his name, king of righteousness, and then he is also king of Salem, that is, king of peace. **3** He is without father or mother or genealogy, having

neither beginning of days nor end of life, but resembling the Son of God he continues a priest forever.

Jesus as King and Priest - this is who He is.

The Israelites could not conceptualize the possibility of being both King and Priest. Melchizedek's life demonstrates that the King of Righteousness can occupy both places at once.

Sandals:

God shows Abram the Stars:

- 1. Stars are reliable and consistent. Still today, shepherds and herders use stars over GPS.
- 2. Stars guide people's lives.
- 3. The culture looked at stars for direction.
- 4. Stars reveal God's glory.
- 5. Stars are each unique.
- 6. The stars are not clustered in one area but spread out to light the entire world.
- 7. Each star is unique in its attributes and named by God Himself (Psalm 147:4).

Key Abrahamic Lesson

Abram loved God for being God Abram's most significant prize was God Himself.

First mention Righteous - was Noah

The roots of Righteousness are one man (Noah) going against culture in obedient actions. Abraham - is where righteousness is tied to faith alone.

Covenant notes:

The Hebrew word for covenant is בְּרִית (berit), which refers to a sacred, binding agreement between parties, often involving God and His people, and can also describe agreements between people or other entities. The term is rooted in the idea of a "cutting" or a solemn, formal arrangement, with the phrase "to make a covenant" literally meaning "to cut a covenant" in the Hebrew Bible.

Blood oaths: blood was used to demonstrate the seriousness of a covenant, and the sacrifice of blood (which symbolized life) gave a binding effect to these critical covenants.

The name El Shaddai is used in the context of this covenant, meaning "God Almighty," referring to the mountain, children, and nation.

Messiah Moment

- 1. God Himself signs the covenant alone.
- 2. Abram (representing all humans) and his descendants are not exposed to any part of the penalty for disobedience.
- 3. No human works, death, or blood can be payment at all for this covenant.
- 4. If Abraham breaks the covenant by being disobedient, a deity must die for the payment of this covenant.

"For when God made the promise to Abraham, since He could swear an oath by no one greater, He swore by Himself..." (Hebrews 6:13).

God's Signature: Cloud and Fire

So it came about on the third day, when it was morning, that there were thunder and lightning flashes and a **thick cloud** over the mountain and a very loud trumpet sound, so that all the people who *were* in the camp trembled. And Moses brought the people out of the camp to meet God, and they stood at the foot of the mountain. Now Mount Sinai *was* all in smoke because the Lord descended upon

it in fire, and its smoke ascended like the **smoke of a furnace**, and the entire mountain quaked violently. When the sound of the trumpet grew louder and louder, Moses spoke, and God answered him with thunder (Exodus 19:16-20, emphasis mine).

New Testament Fire and Cloud examples:

Key Truth:

Our big callings in life will be fulfilled through God's power. Miracle after miracle And step by obedient step.

When Abram is in his frozen state, God tells him about his future descendants being slaves and oppressed for 400 years. Interestingly, the Rabbis start the clock here for the 400 years.

Scholars feel the Israelites were enslaved in Egypt for between 230 and 260 years.

What minimally does Abram understand about this portion:

- 1. Abram will not live long enough to possess the land.
- 2. Abram will not see his descendants possess the land.
- 3. His descendants will be sojourners and enslaved for 400 years.
- 4. The Amorites (Ham's descendants) are not due for judgment until God says so.

God's desire for the world is repentance.

The timing of God's judgments is His decision.

The Angel of the Lord notes: Malak-Yahweh

Exodus 23:20-23 "My name is in him."

In this case, the Angel of the Lord has to be Christ as He makes a covenant. Also, the angel of the Lord is credited for bringing them out of Egypt. Something God credits Himself with later.

Judges 2:1-4

1 Now the angel of the Lord went up from Gilgal to Bochim. And he said, "I brought you up from Egypt and brought you into the land that I swore to give to your fathers. I said, 'I will never break my covenant with you, 2 and you shall make no covenant with the inhabitants of this land; you shall break down their altars.' But you have not obeyed my voice. What is this you have done? 3 So now I say, I will not drive them out before you, but they shall become thorns in your sides, and their gods shall be a snare to you." 4 As soon as the angel of the Lord spoke these words to all the people of Israel, the people lifted up their voices and wept.

The Angel of the Lord:

- 1. His name is incomprehensible, Judges 13. In the Bible, a name is the same as a person's nature or character, so only a divine person has a name beyond comprehension.
- 2. He is omnipresent, Psalm 34:7.
- 3. He forgives sins, Exodus 23 and Zechariah 3.
- 4. He multiplies offspring, Genesis 16:10.

Covenant - continued from Chapters 12 and 15.

This looks repetitive, but in each of the 8 places, God brings more clarification.

This includes the sign of the covenant.

Ch. 17 contains all of the Patriarchal promises of heir, descendants, land, nations, and blessing, all of which appear in this one chapter.

It contains two commands: 1. Live uprightly, 2. Be circumcised.

Who is circumcised?

- 1. All male babies.
- 2. All male servants who were born in the house.
- 3. All male servants who were bought with money.

Read 17:14

If you do not circumcise, you have broken My covenant.

Everlasting covenant?

- The covenant is Everlasting.
- The sign of circumcision on the foreskin of male descendants will change under the New Covenant.
- The circumcision will take place on the hearts of all believers by the Holy Spirit.

The sign of the New Covenant? - Communion Luke 22:20

Jeremiah 31

"Behold, days are coming," declares the Lord, "when I will make a **new covenant** with the house of Israel and the house of Judah, **not like the covenant which I made with their fathers on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt**, My covenant which they broke, although I was a husband to them," declares the Lord. **33** "For this is the covenant which I will make with the house of Israel after those days," declares the Lord: "I will put My law within them and write it on their heart; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people. **34** They will not teach again, each one his neighbor and each one his brother, saying, 'Know the Lord,' for they will all know Me, from the least of them to the greatest of them," declares the Lord, "for I will forgive their wrongdoing, and their sin I will no longer remember."

Deut 30:6, Jer 31:33 - heart change is the goal of God.

Key Biblical Theme

Free Will

Circumcision did not make them part of the covenant (faith did), but to reject circumcision is to reject God's covenant.
