Poetry within the Torah magnifies that portion of text. When we see a
change to poetry, we can note that God wants to magnify that portion.

Genealogies do not include all the ancestors.

The Rule of First mention allows for a foundation for keywords and
often key people.

Biblical Triads allow emphasis to be poured out on the third piece.
(Example: Abram left his country, His Kindred, and his father's house.)

FOIL: A literary device to compare and contrast two characters.

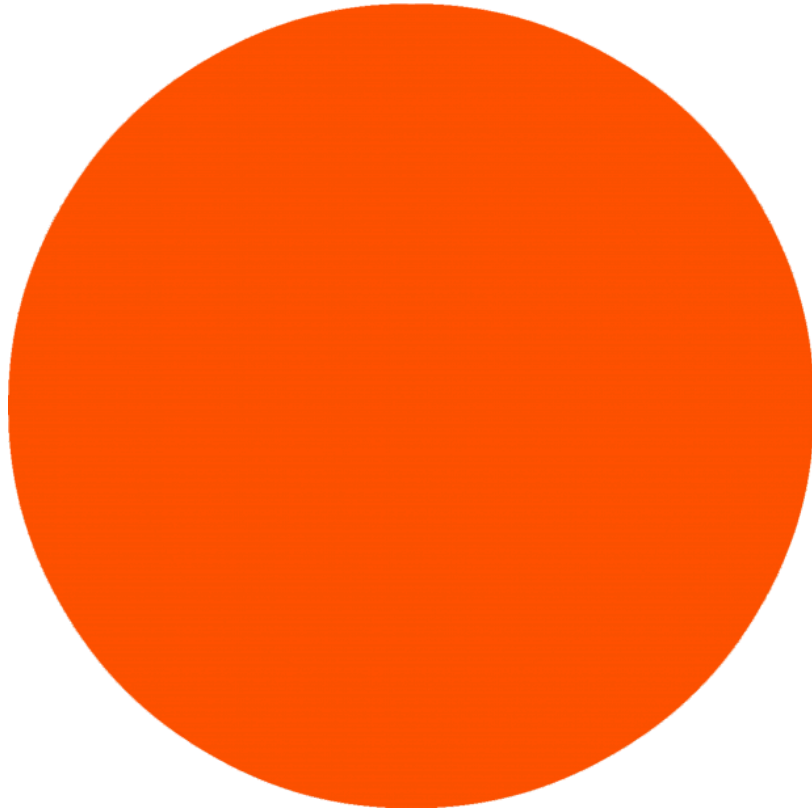
The meaning of names often describes the person's destiny or essence.

Jewish Idioms:

Going in and going out: describes a person's entire life.

Calling on the name of the Lord: Not a request for assistance - It proclaims that God is our God and we are His servants.

Yoke: workload of obedience

Slap on the cheek: High-handed insult

New Testament Exile Pattern:

- famine/slavery
- redemption/deliverance
- Crossing water/baptism
- Wilderness
- Promised land

Jesus exile pattern:

- He chose human life (famine)
- Baptized by John
- Entered the wilderness
- Performed miracles/taught/fulfilled promises (for all wanderers in the wilderness)
- Laid down His life
- Purchased the salvation of all wanderers by His blood.
- Defeated death
- Resurrected or delivered
- Promised land

Typology

The study of patterns, people, events, and symbols that foreshadow Jesus Christ.

Mitzvah - commandment (means connection)

3 kinds of Mitzvahs - Logical, Questionable, Testimonial

10 Items Rabbi's teach were created at twilight of the 6th day.

- . The mouth of the earth (which will swallow Korach)
- . The mouth of the well. (Miriam's well - brought water during the Exodus)
- . The mouth of the donkey. (Balaam's donkey)
- . The rainbow.
- . The manna for the desert.
- . The staff of Moses.
- . The shamir (a type of worm used for engraving).
- . The Writing
- . The tablets of commandments.
- . The letter

Most add: Moses grave, The ram in the bush, and tongs.

Exodus 6:

5 Moreover, I have heard the groaning of the Israelites, whom the Egyptians are enslaving, and I have remembered my covenant.

6 “Therefore, say to the Israelites: ‘I am the LORD, and I will bring you out from under the yoke of the Egyptians. I will free you from being slaves to them, and I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and with mighty acts of judgment. **7** I will take you as my own people, and I will be your God. Then you will know that I am the LORD your God, who brought you out from under the yoke of the Egyptians. **8** And I will bring you to the land I swore with uplifted hand to give to Abraham, to Isaac and to Jacob. I will give it to you as a possession. I am the LORD.’”

Passover Lamb:

Unblemished one-year-old lamb.

On the tenth day, the lamb came into their home -

On the 14th day the lamb was slaughtered

Blood was placed on the door frame

The passover lamb was slain in the temple from 3 pm to 5 pm.

Everyone needs to eat of the passover lamb.

No bones can be broken.

Jesus was a full-grown male, unblemished.

Jesus entered Jerusalem on the 10th Day.

Jesus died on the 14th day of the cross at 3 pm - the time of the first passover lamb.

Jesus says Unless you eat of my body, you can have no part of me.

Jesus' bones were not broken.

The hyssop plant was raised up to Jesus on the cross as a final act of a human.
